Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Many of us feel especially nostalgic during Advent and Christmas. With the spirit of giving and sharing, everywhere we look, it's the perfect time to reflect on days gone by. Memories of celebrations of the birth of our Blessed Savior through the years, bring us smiles and sometimes, even tears. The decorations, lights, gifts, bells and Nativity scenes transport us to moments with our families. This is often the time we think of them most.

Carrying precious cargo, these loving parents remained faithful to God. Even in the midst of great danger and personal sacrifice, Mary and Joseph put Christ first.

What wonderful lessons from our Holy Mother and Earthly Patron! When we put our Savior first and place our families in His care, we will be forever blessed.

Take time to treasure your family during this very special season. After all, the ability to give love and to receive love, is the greatest gift we share, as followers of Christ. May the Lord's peace and grace be with you this Christmas, and throughout 2015!

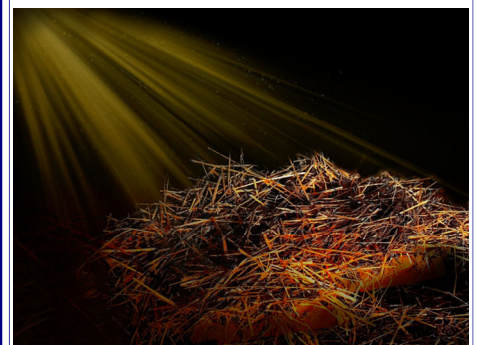

Dear Parishioners of St. Anne,

As some of you know, I recently acquired a border collie named (for now) 'Buddy'. Still a puppy, but I'm often struck that Buddy is on his better behavior (he doesn't have what could be qualified as 'best' behavior yet...) when around other people. When he's just with me, he is usually a stinker. Come to think of it, parents often tell me they have a similar experience when they attend parent-teacher conferences, and hear glowing reports about their children. They sometimes wonder if the teacher is talking about the wrong kid.

At Christmas, we recall that God sent his only Son to take on our humanity. God could have just sent an angel to tell us that he loves us, but chose to radically prove his love. Immanuel means "God with us", and this is the message of Christmas. God comes to be "with" us, to immerse himself in the human condition. Therefore, he knows intimately every single aspect of our individual human lives – the good, the bad, and the ugly. He knows when we are good (probably because we remind Him), and he knows when we are stinkers. Nevertheless, he does not shrink in the least from his mission of loving us and forgiving us – not because we 'deserve it' in any way, but just because he is the Giver of gifts. My prayer for you this Christmas is that you come to know God, just a little more, and discover him as he truly is. And that this knowledge and experience leads you to love him in return, and grow more and more in the image of his Divine Son.. May the love and warmth of these days fire your hearts and keep them lit for all eternity.

Echoing Mary's Decision

The angel Gabriel today confronts Mary with a mystery. The mystery of salvation in Christ is not a mystery that is solved, but a reality beyond our comprehension that we must choose to enter into. In the liturgy of the Eastern Church, everyone waits to see if Mary will enter into the mystery: God waits, Adam and Eve and all the souls of the dead who long for paradise wait, angels wait for new heavenly companions. And there is much rejoicing when her decision is "yes."

We have less dramatic choices offered to us, but the mystery of our salvation in Christ is by no means "solved." We may understand it a bit better due to Mary's "yes." We may be a bit closer to it through the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. But it still remains a mystery to which we all must give our own "yes." Soon we will be singing "O come, let us adore him." May our Advent prayer, our echo of Mary's "yes," continue then, so we may enter into the mystery of our salvation in Jesus Christ, God among us.

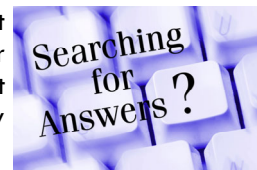

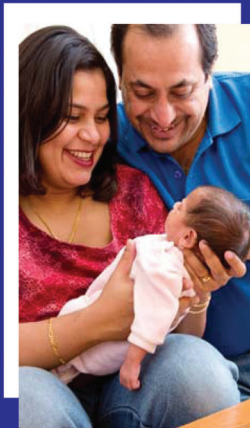
