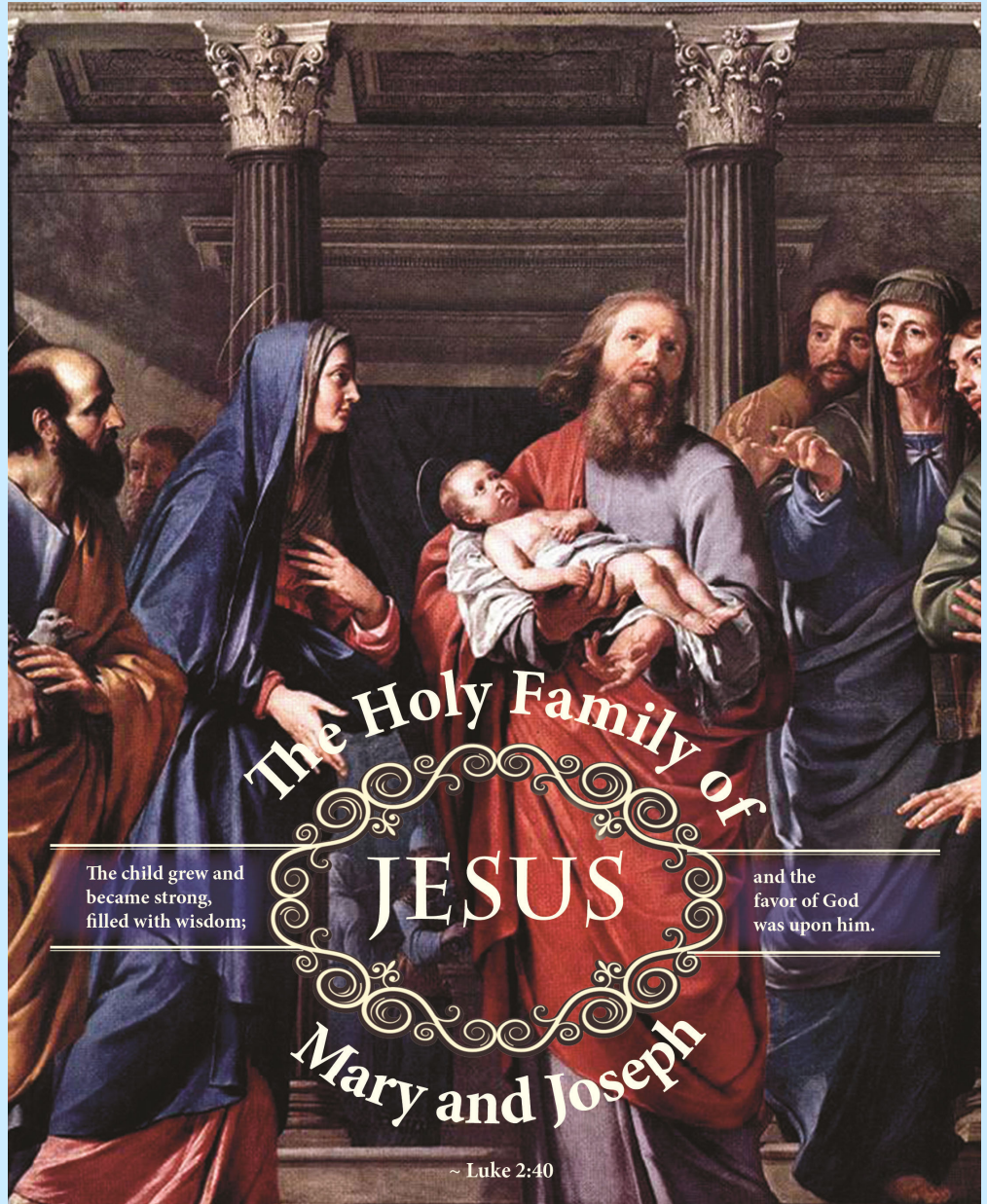

Dear St. Anne parishioners,

As I sit here a week before Christmas, I'm watching the Costco building go up across the street, just northwest of the parish. In some ways, this is a most fitting image for the New Year, which is a time for fresh starts on this "project", our life on earth. With all the systems that are involved, I'm sure that building a Costco store is not easy, even though from a distance, they do make it look easy. It's amazing how quickly it is being built!

When formulating resolutions for the New Year, it's always the "brick and mortar" projects, the more visible ones, which are the easiest to grasp. Lose weight, learn a language, plan to have one family meal a day, and the like. As you go down the list, the less visible realities, such as the spiritual life, tend to get short shrift. This is true, even though the less visible realities are the most important. When you think about questions like "what is more important than friendship with God?" or "what is more important than getting to heaven?", this truth comes more into focus. So I'd like you to think about the less visible realities as you formulate your Fresh Start 2015. Make time for prayer. Build a sacramental life that is solid and constant. Start with the sacrament of Reconciliation, well prepared, which conforms your life to God. Deeply root your human relationships in the commandment of Christ to love God with all our heart and soul, and to love our neighbor as we love ourselves.

In all of these ways, you can build a spiritual edifice that will stand the test of time and storm. Even better than a Costco!

The scriptures of Israel are filled with many stories of barren couples who were miraculously granted the gift of children by God. Surely the best known among these is the first reading from today, from which Luke took inspiration when he recounted the miraculous birth of John the Baptist to Zechariah and Elizabeth, and the more miraculous birth of Jesus to Mary and Joseph. In each instance, we are given examples or role models of those who trusted in God. More than examples of those who trust, they are models of self-surrender. They abandoned their own presuppositions and prejudices about the workings of the world and turned their lives over to belief in a God who can make life grow where none ought to; a God who can turn death around into a new and unimagined life; a God who can, today, take a tiny child of humble parents in an insignificant town and make him into a light for all the world. This is what we, as God's holy family, are called to do each day: to trust not in ourselves and the way we think things should be, but to open ourselves and surrender ourselves in faith to a God of endless promise.

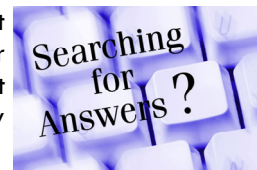

Help Lower Infant Mortality Rates

For 75 years, Finland's expectant mothers have been given a box by the state that serves as a starter kit for their new baby. It contains clothes, blankets, and other newborn necessities, and the box itself – lined with a mattress – can even be used as the child's first bed. It is believed that these baby boxes have helped Finland achieve one of the world's lowest infant mortality rates.

The Baby Box Company is collaborating with Wheaton Franciscan St. Joseph Women's Outpatient Center to help lower the infant mortality rate in the area in which they serve. The goal is to give 600 Baby Boxes in 2015 (the number of families expected to go through the Women's Outpatient Center for their prenatal care and birth in 2015) to Wheaton Franciscan for them to give to new families to take home. To manufacture and fill each Baby Box, and to cover shipping from California, each Baby Box for Milwaukee will cost \$100, a total of \$60,000 is needed to be able to supply the 600 expectedly needed for 2015 in Milwaukee.

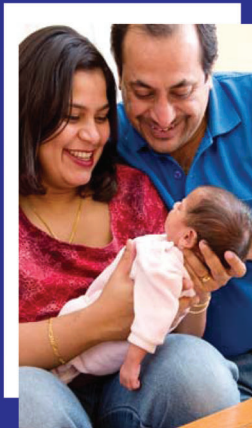

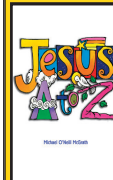
