Nearly ten years before, a son and father had parted ways when the business they shared went bankrupt. The son blamed the father. They did not speak to each other again.

Then the father became seriously ill. The mother called the son and told him he had better come soon. The son walked sheepishly into the hospital room. The father motioned his son to him and whispered: "Did you ever think you could do anything that would keep me from loving you?"

Resentment and anger are foul things, the first reading from Sirach tells us. Remember the last things. Stop hating. Live by the commandments. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, we are to live for the Lord and die for the Lord.

Jesus' parable in today's Gospel reminds us of God's compassion. The immense sin of humanity has been forgiven and stricken from the record. We are to forgive others in the same way.

This includes any Catholic adults who were never confirmed and would like to receive that sacrament. **How long does it take?**

The Rite of Christian Initiation process ministers individually to those seeking membership. Some people need more time than others to prepare for a lifetime commitment. 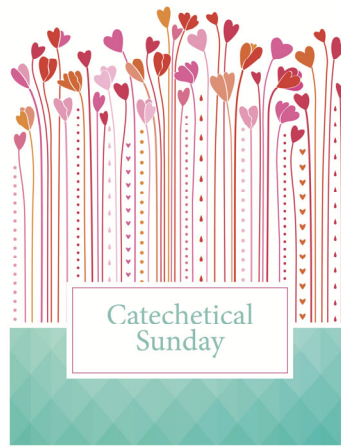
33 Days to Morning Glory

Do you want to transform your relationship with Christ? Join us as we begin a 33-day preparation for Marian Consecration. This is open to all who are interested, as well as for couples. A Little History...

In 1935, the Vatican published *On the Better Care and Promotion of Catechetical Education*, a document that asks every country to acknowledge the importance of the Church's teaching ministry and to honor those who serve the Christian community as catechists. "Catechesis" is from the Greek word meaning "to echo, or resound".

Catechesis is the act of resounding or bringing the Church's teachings to the world. A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church.

Catechesis is a distinct and special ministry in the Church. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* makes clear, "Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life...her inner growth and correspondence with God's plan depend essentially on catechesis" (no.7). This ministry of teaching in the name of the Church has a profound dignity, which is why catechists are formally commissioned by the Church. It is only fitting that we set aside a day to highlight this ministry and invite the entire church community to think about our responsibility to share our faith with others.

Parents are truly the primary catechists of their children. They prepare the soil and plant the first seeds of faith. On Catechetical Sunday, we not only highlight the work of catechists in parishes and schools, but we also commend parents and guardians and encourage them to take seriously their role of making their Catholic households a place where faith is passed on to the next generation.

Catechetical Sunday is traditionally celebrated on the third Sunday of September so we commission our catechists at St. Anne at the 9:15am Mass this week.

God, Our Father,

Thank you for sending us catechists who sow and nurture the seeds of faith that You so graciously provide for us. Through their efforts we draw closer to You.

Bless these men and women who serve the Church as catechists. Strengthen them so that they may give faithful witness to You always. Enkindle in them the fire of Your love so that they may share Your light and warmth with those they teach.

May they live lives of Christian witness, being for us beacons in the darkness, shining as mirrors who reflect Your light and love to all they meet. Let it be said about these catechists, "For them, life is Christ!" We ask this in Jesus' name through the Holy Spirit. Amen.

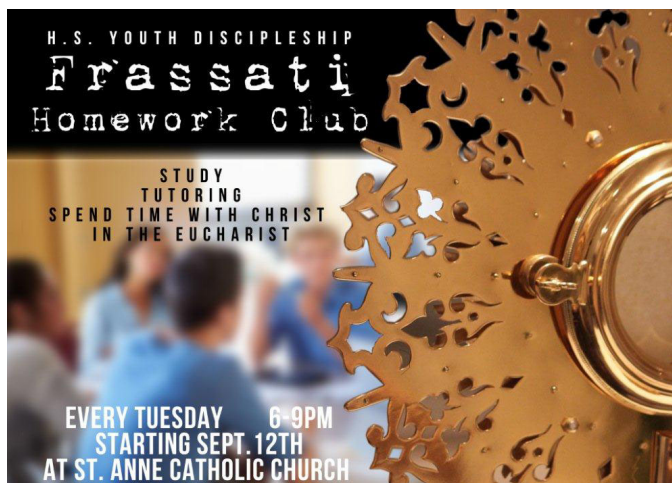
