CALLED BY GOD

Today's scriptures invite us to listen to two calls. The first is the call issued by the LORD to the prophet Amos, the "shepherd and a dresser of sycamores" (Amos 7:14). The second is the call the Lord Jesus issued to the Twelve, whom he sent out "two by two" (Mark 6:7). These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say yes to the call we hear once again through God's living word.

From the Desk of Richard Sosa, Director of Youth Ministry

In the Gospel of John, when John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him, he said "BEHOLD, the lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."

At this moment John was able to recognize Jesus. Not just as a man but as the Messiah, the Son of God. Thus began Jesus' Ministry. One that would command us to love each other, to see Jesus in each other. In 1 John 4:20 we are asked "How can we say we Love God whom we cannot see?" If you "do not love those that we do see?" Two years ago, I went on mission in Chicago with a group of High School women from St. Anne. We did street ministry and met a lot of people, mostly homeless. We met a man named Willie and he wanted me to share his story. He was working a corner in Chicago, asking for spare change. During every red light, he'd go out and walk along the line of cars asking for change. He was 66 at the time, but walked with a gait that seemed more like an 80 year old man. This is what he had to say about being homeless.

"The worst thing is waking up cold, and you never get your feet warm. You're feet are never warm out here. And you have to be very careful because you can lose limbs. I know a lot of people out here that don't have toes and things like that. I can go into Burger King and sit in there for two hours and I'm still cold. You gotta be right on the heat to get warm. But that still don't make me an angry person cuz I worked all my life and I've never been to the penitentiary, or things like that. Things just happen. So God bless you and everybody, for sending me beautiful people to help me out so I can keep working to try to get a little change so I don't have to stay out here tonight. This meal, makes today all worth it." Like John the Baptist do we see Jesus? Can we see him in Willie? In others, do you see Jesus in everyone, even those that might seem difficult to love?

Do you know someone homeless? I'm pretty sure you do. In fact I would venture to guess at some point we've all been homeless at least once in our life.

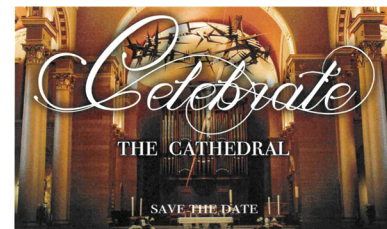
How can that be though? I've always had a home, I've always had a place to stay, I've never been on the street? Look around. Do you see the homeless? They are the ones that even in a crowded room, feel alone. They are the ones that feel worthless because of the way they look or because of the way someone has mistreated them? They are the guilt ridden who can't let go of their sins and can't step into a church for fear that everyone will know the terrible things they have done. Do you see the homeless? They are the ones that live in fear; So much so they are paralyzed from living life to the full. They are the hopeless who can't see a way out of their situation. They are blinded in darkness, just the way the devil likes it. We've all been or felt homeless, hopeless, worthless, friend-less at some point in our life. In this way we are no different that our brothers and sisters on the street, HOMELESS...and at the same time, HOME has always just been prayer away. "BEHOLD, the lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." "God, let me make my home in You and You in me. Live inside of me Jesus. I Need You Lord." Amen.
