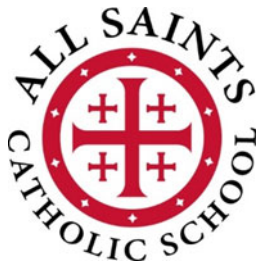
Join Us at the Kenosha Veritas Society Dinner & Auction!

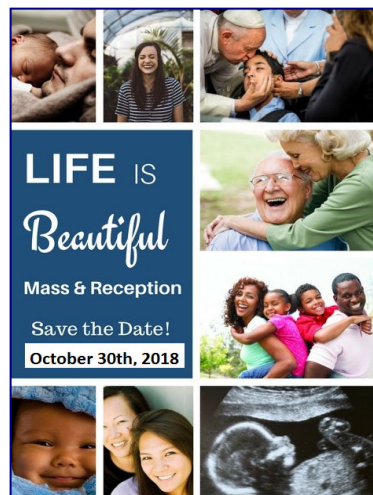
