

TOO MUCH INFORMATION!

There is a common expression: "Too much information!" We usually use it when people tell us details about their lives that we don't want or need to know. Today, when James and John ask Jesus a simple question, making their request for places of honor in the kingdom, a simple answer might have been in order. Instead, as he often does, Jesus answers a question with a question; today it's about drinking the cup of suffering. Then, once the others are indignant over James and John's outrageous request, he proceeds to give them what may have been "too much information" for followers who were simply interested in the pursuit of glory. But this information, though it can sometimes seem "too much" for us, is essential for our lives as disciples. In Isaiah, in Hebrews, and in Mark today, we learn this information. It is in suffering, in weakness, in self-giving service to others, that we come to understand the kingdom. It is the information we need to find our place and come to be honored in the reign of God.



Josie and I wanted to say thank everyone in the parish for your support as team members of Our Lady of the Angels Mission in Chicago. On **October 7th**, we ran the Chicago Marathon as part of TEAM OLA. Together with other missionary runners, we were able to raise over **\$150,000** which will go directly to the work of the Franciscans of the Eucharist in Humboldt Park, Chicago.

Here's a little backstory to our experience: My wife Josie always gives 100% and with a gentle smile. No questions asked. She is the kind of wife Deacon Richard Stanula talked about in his homily the night before the marathon. This was her 4th Chicago Marathon in 11 years. She didn't train like she wishes she could have. A cut to the achilles more than ten weeks before the marathon guaranteed that she would not be able to train the last three months and her training was less than stellar this whole year. Even so, she still she was quietly confident. Not confident in her own ability but confident how God would carry her through this test of endurance and suffering. This is what I love about her. She is the poster girl for guts, faith and perseverance. I don't know any other person in my life that would do this. NO ONE! But to her, its "just a marathon". I'm not trying to minimize the distance or the discipline of anyone who has trained for this. It is an event that demands commitment for a long time. Someone asked her "why are you doing this?" and she simply says, "We promised the Sisters in Chicago we would." So she kept her promise like she always does. I didn't try to dissuade her even though she only ran one time in the last 12 months. These are the things that make her Josie. So we asked for many prayers to help her and us along the route of the Chicago Marathon. Regarding the race itself, my wife Josie and I ran the first 12 miles together but I knew after the first mile that this would be extra challenging for her. Before we hit the mile marker her breathing was labored, her facial expressions could not hide her pain from lack of conditioning. We would walk a couple blocks every mile and start up again. After about 6 miles, I became more concerned and told her if she continued to struggle maybe she should just drop out and head to to finish area. She'd have no part in dropping out. For the next 6 miles she would hold on to my Golden OLA jersey to keep her from falling behind. At 12 miles she gently told me, "GO! Go ahead, its ok. I'll be fine. Really, go, run your race." So I kissed her good bye and asked God to continue to be with her. At mile 15 she called me and sounded rejuvenated. It gave me some peace of mind hearing her voice and shortly after that, both our phones died. I finished the race about 1 hour and 20 minutes ahead of her. I waited by the Med tent at the finish just in case she needed to be treated. (This happened at her last marathon.) I can't tell you how elated I was to see her come to the finish pretty much unscathed and smiling! God is good! I'm sure He was saying to her, "Well done my good and faithful servant!" We both we're so humbled to be a part of Team OLA. We cannot wait to run again next year but between now and then, we cannot wait to do more work with Our Lady of the Angels Mission. We plan on bringing our youth group from Wisconsin down to help with the Christmas Party. Because of this run, St. Anne Parish now knows much about OLA and is eager to help anyway they can even though we are 80 miles away. 

Faith Formation Seeking Volunteers!




