But it is a Bible quote, from today's Gospel. The person who said it also once declared, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Yes, it's Peter! So today's announcement seems quite the comedown. Last Sunday Jesus said, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." But Peter seems determined to return to his pre-apostolic occupation, until Jesus intervenes, making Peter's later announcement deeper, "Lord, you know that I love you," and Peter's apostolic calling clearer, "Tend my sheep." Peter does so. Acts presents the consequences: Peter declares, "We must obey God rather than men." As Revelation proclaims, "Worthy is the Lamb"—to receive Peter's lifelong service, and ours. ## ***St. Anne Catholic Church Pastoral Council Nominations***

This year **3 new** council members will be selected to serve three-year terms.

If you are sensing a call to serve St. Anne on Pastoral Council, please consider nominating yourself. If you have observed others in the parish who you think have the qualities needed for spiritual leadership, nominate them.

### ***What does a pastoral council member do? Pastoral council members are asked to live our values:***

- Provide spiritual leadership for our parish and “Pray daily”
- Have a concern for the whole parish, “Know what is right”,
- “Dig for Truth” and learn about their faith, their church, and their parish
- Make a three year commitment, “Give to others”.
- Participate in monthly council meetings, an annual pastoral council retreat, leadership meetings, and “Speak up and Speak Out” by involving themselves in our church ministries.
- Be a registered member of the parish who is baptized and over 18 years of age

### ***What kinds of qualities are needed for spiritual leadership?***

- Firm belief and understanding of the mission of the Church, our parish vision as a “haven of God’s love”, and our parish mission of a place “where all people can encounter Christ”.
- A willingness to listen to others’ viewpoints and freely share personal viewpoints
- Ability to relate to people, to work as a team member, and to reach agreement through consensus
- Willingness to participate in ongoing leadership formation

An informational meeting will be held for all those nominated on **Thursday May 16<sup>th</sup> at 6pm** at the church to learn more about the responsibilities of parish council membership. The discernment process will be discussed and nominees will also have an opportunity to ask questions. The discernment meeting to select the 3 new members will take place ***immediately*** thereafter at 7:00 p.m.

Pastoral Council meets on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. It consists of the pastor, 2 trustees, and 7 at-large members. Those discerned to serve on Pastoral Council will attend their first Pastoral Council meeting on **Tuesday, June 18<sup>th</sup>**. At this meeting Pastoral Council officers for the next year will be selected.
