ASKING FOR HELP The Beatitudes praise the poor in spirit. One characteristic of those who are poor in spirit is their ability to ask for help; they know when others can provide what they lack. Today's readings encourage us to practice poverty in spirit by asking God for what we need. What could be more natural than to ask God for good things? God is, after all, the inventor of goodness and the giver of all good things.

Asking God for help puts us in conversation with God. These conversations take many forms. The reading from Genesis shows Abraham bantering with God like a skilled negotiator, while Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians praises God for answering us even when we don't deserve it. In Saint Luke's Gospel, Jesus not only gives us words to use in our conversations with God (the Our Father), but also promises that God always listens to our prayers. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

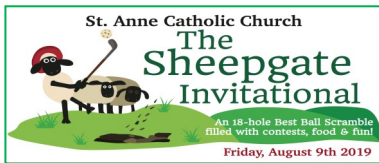

We are all called to serve. By serving, we carry out the command to “love God and neighbor.” During the Summer –St. Anne would like to highlight our amazing Ministries we offer at the parish.

Ministry: Music Ministry and Youth Ministry

Name: Rich Sosa

Family: Wife, Josie, Daughters Madeline and Carmen, Dogs: Rexy, Kolbe, and Lulu.

How many years have you been a parishioner at St. Anne? We’ve been active at St. Anne since 2013 when I came on as Director of Music and Youth Ministry.

What unexpected Blessing have you received from being a part of this ministry? Maybe it’s not unexpected but in all the ministries I’m involved in here at St. Anne, I have gained and made some amazing friendships. I don’t take those for granted. They truly are blessings in my life and my family’s life! My fellow musicians, catechists, youth, and parents all have been a blessing in more ways than they will every know.

What is one thing you wish people knew about your Ministry ? 1. With regard to Music Ministry, I would say that you don’t have to be a trained musician to worship. Everyone can worship, even from the pews. As a worship leader, the most beautiful sound is when I stop signing and hear the congregation singing/worshipping/chanting with heartfelt praise. I also want everyone at Mass to realize the abundant tradition of music available to us as Catholics. In any given Mass we may be pulling from Aquinas’ compositions (13th Century) to hymns from the 18th Century (Holy God We Praise thy Name) including Holy Holy Holy which lyrically gets its inspiration from First Council of Nicaea (326AD). But we also like to draw from more recent hymns from such composers as Haas, Haugen, Farrell, Maher and Crowder just to name a few. Before every Mass, our ministry team prays for our entire parish. We pray for healing of mind, body and soul. WE also pray that in some humble way, our worship can help those in Mass encounter the risen Christ’s. So take heart that every Sunday, someone, actually many of us are praying for you. 2. Regarding Youth Ministry, I’d like our parish to know that Youth Ministry begins at home. Parents have such a huge responsibility AND opportunity to guide and teach the faith in a living breathing way. We are living Body of Christ. A youth minister once said, “your goal as youth ministers is to make our role obsolete.”, meaning if we can reach not just the youth but the entire family in living an intentional life of discipleship, there would be no need for what we do in Youth Ministry. Families would spiritually thrive organically. But, we’re not there yet and we are here to help support you and your family. I do know that teens that have actively participated in youth group, conferences and mission trips have been forever impacted.

Who can serve on your Ministry? If you have a desire to worship and have some talent musically, then you can contact me at rsosa@saint-anne.org. We can talk about how you think God is calling you to Music Ministry. If you feel called to work with our youth, contact me! We can sit down, have some coffee and chat!

How has your Ministry connected you to Christ? This is cliché but whenever you give, you actually receive more than you give. I found this to be true in every aspect of ministry I’ve ever been involved in. Whether through friendships, mission trips, youth events, weddings, funerals, or Sunday Mass.

What is something you’d like to share with the Parish about yourself?

Though I was raised Catholic all my life, I wasn’t always a practicing Catholic. I wandered like many people do but God is a persistent hunter and He didn’t quit until I tired running from Him. You can never outrun God and if you say YES to Him , the Holy Spirit will fill you with what you need to do God’s work. I don’t have a music background/education. I can to music late in life but to me that just shows how awesome God is! He is always more generous than we can ever be. Let Him surprise you. Trust in His plans. God bless you!

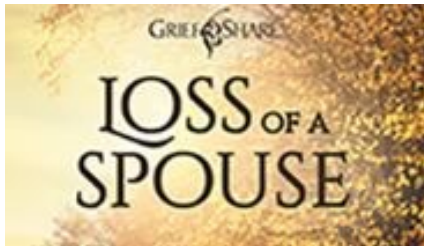

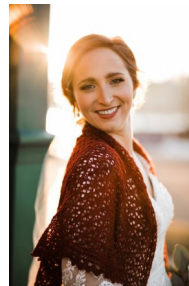
