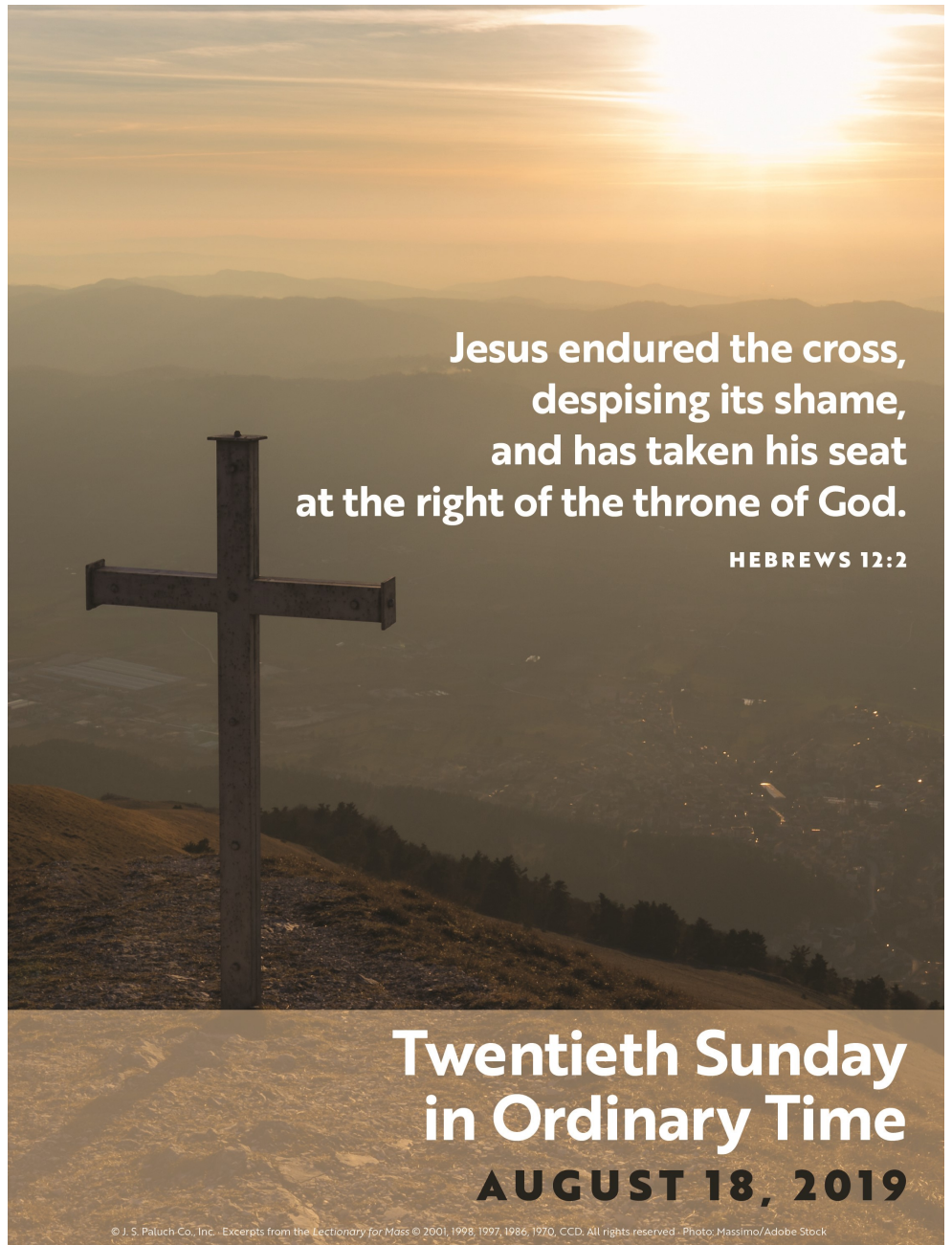

Greetings to the people of St. Anne's! My name is Daniel Smyth, and I am a seminarian at St. Francis De Sales Seminary. As part of my formation, I have been assigned to assist Fr. Bob with his ministry.

My parents raised my four brothers and me in a small country town in central Wisconsin. We lived the faith of the Catholic Church, played hockey, and enjoyed the outdoors. After high school, I attended the University of Notre Dame, and I graduated in 2014 with a degree in mechanical engineering.

Since I was a kid, I have been drawn to the Rocky Mountains, and so after university, I moved west to work as a mechanical engineer for 3 years, in Utah. During that time, God allowed me activity—fly fishing. It was also during my time out west that I heard, for the first time, the call to priesthood. I was grateful for my job, and I had big dreams of marriage and family, so it took some time for me to accept the Father's plan for me. Thankfully, He is patient and loving. Slowly, through many little acts of surrender, my desires conformed to God's desires, and in the summer of 2017, I left my job and joined the seminary under the sponsorship of the La Crosse diocese. Earlier this year, I completed a 2 year philosophy program at Mundelein Seminary in Archdiocese of Chicago.

Now, I will begin theological studies at St. Francis De Sales Seminary. God willing, I will be ordained a priest in four years. Although there are many dimensions of the priesthood that draw me, more than anything, I desire to be a priest of Jesus Christ because of the Eucharist-centered prayer life. I believe I was made for that.

I look forward to serving the people of St. Anne's parish. It is always a great joy and privilege for me to encounter the lives of the faithful. I know that God will use these experiences to accomplish His work. Praise to our Lord, Jesus Christ.
