## LOST AND FOUND

Welcome to “Lost and Found Sunday”! Just in case being in church makes us proudly consider ourselves especially religious, today’s Gospel suggests that we’d be wiser to admit that we’re sometimes lost. Then we’ll eventually be happily counted among Jesus’ “found,” because today Jesus focuses on a lost sheep, lost coin, lost son. Jesus does so because the Pharisees and scribes, proudly considering themselves especially religious, “began to complain” that Jesus “welcomes sinners and eats with them.” So Jesus warns them—and us—to stop judging others. Marvel instead that God’s amazing grace has found us! Indeed, we should become Jesus’ friends lovingly trying to find others. So Exodus asks, if God “relented in punishment” and pardoned us, shouldn’t we forgive fellow sinners graciously? Even Paul admits his “arrogance” as “foremost among sinners.” We too, happy at being “mercifully treated,” should share with everyone else Jesus’ unfailing patience.

## **Hard as Nails Presents the St. Anne Family Parish Mission**

St. Anne's Catholic Church will be holding a **You're Amazing Family Parish Mission** presented by Hard as Nails Ministries. Building on the traditional parish mission model, the You're Amazing Family Parish Mission is a special encounter with Jesus Christ designed to reach every segment of the parish community—grammar school children, middle school and high school students, parents, the senior community, and everyone in between. The theme of the family parish mission is *"Living Passion | Passion Living."*

There are two tracks for the HN Family Parish Mission. Hard as Nails missionaries conduct the sessions with the children and students (while providing content and presentation styles geared to be age-appropriate). HN main speaker Justin Fatica conducts the mission sessions for the adults. On the second night of the mission, children and adults come together for a special evening of prayer, witness, and sharing. Justin Fatica will be joined on October 2 by Fr. Peter John Cameron, O.P., Director of Formation of Hard as Nails Ministries.

**The St. Anne Family Parish Mission will take place October 1 & 2, 2019 at St. Anne Catholic Church, 9091 Prairie Ridge Blvd. Pleasant Prairie, WI, from 7:00 to 9:00 pm (doors open at 6:30 both nights).**

Hard as Nails Ministries is a national Catholic evangelization apostolate with a special outreach to youth. HN was founded in 2002 by Justin Fatica, star of the HBO Documentary *Hard as Nails* and the author of two best-selling books. Fatica and a team of 18-25-year-old-volunteer missionaries traverse the country evangelizing by way of sixteen different types of Hard as Nails events, all in the promotion of its mission: "To awaken the world to the power of God's love."

Hard as Nails events help people come to know God's love for them in an intimate way. Struggles are put into perspective, burdens are lifted, healing takes place. Relationships are repaired and reinvigorated so that families can realize how much they need one another. They are able to express their love for one another like never before. People leave the event more grateful for their families, for God...and even for their suffering! The encouragement, forgiveness, and hope experienced move people to come together as a community of believers and to commit to their faith with newfound fever. The experience impacts people to encourage, love, and serve one another with lasting passion.

As the Catholic Church finds itself embroiled in widespread crises, Hard as Nails is responding with a new way of evangelizing that focuses on caring for all people by accompanying them in their suffering. Offering an approach that is both innovative and a little edgy, HN has impacted thousands of lives and brought many of the disillusioned, the unchurched, "nones", and young people back to church.

**Please join us Tuesday, September 24 at 7pm at St. James Parish for an exciting, free presentation about our Christian brethren in Iraq.** One of the world's oldest Christian communities resides in Iraq and unfortunately, their numbers have dwindled from 1.5 million in 2003 to less than 250,000.

Approximately half of the remaining Christians have been displaced from their homes and churches since 2014. Join us for a unique opportunity to hear the history and current plight of Iraqi Christians who have experienced 1400 years of persecution from two eye witnesses. **Marina Ishaya-Teets**, was born in Kuwait but grew up in Iraq. She came with her family to the United States after four years in Jordan while waiting for process of immigration documents. In 2008, she returned to Iraq for four years to serve as a linguist/translator for the U.S. Army. She speaks Assyrian and Arabic and currently resides in Arlington Heights, Illinois with her husband. Carl Holborn, is a parishioner of St. James Parish and serves on All Saints School Board and Milwaukee Archbishop's CRS (Catholic Relief Services) Planning Committee. In spring 2019, he visited Iraq and witnessed the current situation of the remaining Christians. The evening is free but free will offerings will be accepted for Saint Vincent de Paul's food pantry. Refreshments and fellowship will follow in St. James Rectory.
