A CHRISTMAS REPRISE

The Church's celebration three weeks ago of the Baptism of the Lord signaled the "official" end of the Christmas season. Today's feast of the Presentation of the Lord seems to extend the Incarnation celebration a bit longer. In fact, some have called this feast a "second Epiphany."

The first reading recalls the anticipation of Advent, as Malachi writes, "Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me." The reading from Hebrews reminds us of the Incarnation, proclaiming that Jesus had a "share" in our own "blood and flesh." The Gospel finds the infant Jesus on his first visit to Jerusalem and his human parents once again surprised and in awe over the events surround his birth.

In the simplicity of the manger, in the grandeur of the temple, in the domesticity of Nazareth, Jesus comes. May we come to know him and so be filled with "wisdom" and the "favor of God."

Beginning this **Saturday, January 25th through Sunday, February 9th**, we will have a few items on display that can be purchased through our on-line bidding site <https://qtego.net/qlink/saintanne/register> with the "Buy it Now" option or ordered with check or cash at the Winter Social Information table. These options give EVERYONE the chance to see & purchase auction items. We have access to an unlimited quantity of the framed, ready to hang, wool banners with the evolution of the team's logo over the years. We will have the most popular banners on display along with a full list of professional and collegiate banners that are available to order. Both purchase options are for \$75. Your purchase will be available for pick-up at church no later than February 22nd.

How to Bid With Qtego

We will have more information at the Winter Social Table as well as several volunteers to help you. We know this is new to everyone and we want everyone to understand how it works and we are more than happy to help you. It is best to register your phone before the event.

How do I register for mobile bidding?

To register go to <https://qtego.net/qlink/saintanne>. Click the "Register for Event" button, enter your information. Click "Submit Registration" when done. You will receive registration text messages from Qtego. Click your personal link in the second text message and you are ready to start bidding.

How to Enter the Pin and where to find it.

Your PIN is the last 4 characters of the URL that you see in the text message. To view current bids or see how to bid, reply to this message with the 3 digit item number then SEND or click the link qtego.net/?i=XXXX (The XXXX is your PIN)

How do I bid on an Item?

On the Qsite, click the item picture, then click the SUBMIT BID button. If texting, text the item number followed by the bid amount, ex: 123 500 will bid \$500 on item 123. You will receive a confirmation text from Qtego. If you do not have a smartphone, mobile phone or access to the internet, Qtego representatives in orange shirts will be available to place bids for you as well as several St. Anne Parishioners'.

Will I be able to donate/give cash?

Yes, guests will be able to donate during the event and pay cash when they check out at the end of the auction. On the Qsite, select "Donate" button and select the amount you wish to donate or enter an amount in whole dollars and press "Submit Donation". If texting, reply to any Qtego text with the word GIVE, followed by the amount.
