DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

WHOEVER DOES NOT TAKE UP HIS CROSS AND FOLLOW ME IS NOT WORTHY OF ME

What does the cross look like that we are called to carry? They all will be different among us. We all suffer from something. For some it may be alcoholism or drug addiction. For others, it may be a sickness that you have no control over. Whatever it may be, it gives us daily pain, a pain that we can offer up to Jesus for our sins committed and for the poor souls in purgatory. Then there are some of us who may be healthy but in need financially. We may have sickness in the family or someone who does not go to church, or believe anymore in God. Children that have grown up and don't go to Mass on Sunday or have left the Catholic faith for a different religion, and we pray for them to return. We may have family members that have dangerous jobs like Firefighters or Police Officers that put their life on the line daily for their communities. The list can go on, we all have something.

Jesus asks us to take up our lives as they are for His name's sake. Now what is a way we can do this? We need to live the life of a strong faithful Christian devoted to Jesus. St. Gregory of Nyssa says that this is done by starting with our thoughts, then our words, and finally in the actions that we perform. We are to make sure that all three are controlled by Jesus.

When our thoughts are with Jesus, it is then that the words we will speak are of Christ coming from our hearts. You see, this is because Jesus knows our thoughts, and then our hearts and minds are connected. The love of Jesus, His thoughts mixed with ours work together to create in us a Christian perfection. Taking up one's cross refers to managing any and all of the difficulties and challenges that come with following Jesus. Let the image of the cross of Jesus always come to mind for us.

The actions that we perform will be prayer but also any action that will be relative to the cross that we may be carrying. It may be to assist someone, care for someone, or visit someone. The actions can be possibly just our way of life that we lead for the greater glory of God. Life is good, not because it is comfortable, relaxed, or even appealing, but because it is a gift from God. Our Gospel reading calls us to love Christ more than life itself.

St. Gregory says; "Christ's purity, however, is the fountainhead; ours has its source in Him and flows out of Him. Our life is stamped with the beauty of His thought."
