### ST. ANNE CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Per the directives of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, the following precautions will be taken:

- Seating will be restricted to every other pew.
- There will be teams of volunteers after each Mass that will clean/disinfect the church. If you would like to volunteer for one of the cleaning teams please stay after Mass to do so.
- There will be an overflow area in the gathering once the church has reached 25% capacity. There will be chairs already set up. Feel free to move the chairs as needed to accommodate your family. These chairs will also be disinfected after each Mass.

#### Offertory Procedures

- For the offertory, we will not pass the baskets through the church, but rather place baskets in the sanctuary. You can leave your offering before or after Mass, or during the offertory time.

#### Communion Procedures

- Communion will ONLY be distributed by Fr. Bob. During the distribution of the Eucharist, Fr. Bob will come to each person as they are kneeling in the pew. Please do not leave the pews during Communion.

## SOUP KITCHEN CANCELED



# DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

## REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

**COME TO ME, ALL YOU WHO LABOR AND ARE BURDENED,  
AND I WILL GIVE YOU REST.**

Just last week Jesus wanted us to take up our crosses and follow Him, and we all have crosses to bear. This week Jesus is saying that we should come to Him and He will provide us the rest we need. I guess it can sound a little confusing. Well Jesus tells His disciples that He Himself is the yoke, meek and humble of heart.

Now we need to go back to see what is the term yoke that Jesus used. You see back then a yoke was a type of a wooden harness, bar, or a frame used to keep oxen (or cattle) driving in the same direction, at the urging of a master. It was to help them.

This is what Jesus is saying in a way. He wants us to harness ourselves to Him and He Himself will be the yoke to lead us in the right direction because He is meek and humble of heart. He wants us to follow Him. We then imitate Jesus' ways, His attitudes, His dispositions, and His general way of being in the world. The world that we live in that is full of the sin and hate that tries to devour us. We try to be like Jesus in all we do and in the problems we encounter in our daily lives.

This of course isn't going to be easy. We must open our hearts to love others. In doing this we also open ourselves up for the pain, the disappointment, and the grief. And yet, our sure hope is in the Lord that light is stronger in the darkness, love is stronger than hatred, and life is stronger than death. This hope eases the burden of the cross, transforming it to the yoke of Jesus. If we reflect on this then perhaps it helps to give us insight into who really carries our crosses when we are yoked together with the Lord of life. In a way the burden is being carried together.

First we are yoked to Jesus through our prayer, trust, and love. During all the crosses and fear that we face in life, it is the Mass, Eucharist, and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that is our strong harness to Jesus. Then it is Jesus who eases our burdens whatever they may be. Remember, Jesus always focuses on the needs of others. He is gentle and considerate, all merciful, and all loving.

Jesus is a real specialist because you see He actually works through our weakness, because there lies our strength. Jesus said to St. Paul, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Cor 12:9)
