ST. ANNE CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Per the directives of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, the following precautions will be taken:

- Seating will be restricted to every other pew.
- Cleaning after Mass will continue.
- There will be an overflow area in the gathering once the church has reached 25% capacity. There will be chairs already set up. Feel free to move the chairs as needed to accommodate your family. These chairs will also be disinfected after each Mass.

Offertory Procedures

 For the offertory, we will not pass the baskets through the church, but rather place baskets in the sanctuary. You can leave your offering before or after Mass, or during the offertory time.

Communion Procedures

• Communion will ONLY be distributed by Fr. Bob. During the distribution of the Eucharist, Fr. Bob will come to each person as they are kneeling in the pew. Please do not leave the pews during Communion.

*The dispensation from the Sunday Obligation to attend Mass has been extended to August 2nd.

PARISH TRUSTEE-TREASURER ELECTION

Steve Fredriksson's term as Trustee-Treasurer has concluded. This means we will need to elect a new Trustee-Treasurer. The parish corporate by-laws stipulate that trustees are to be selected "from and by the congregation." The pastor may also present one candidate.

If anyone in the parish would like to serve in this position or nominate someone, please use the nomination form found in the Parish Office that will require the signature of ten other registered parishioners. Nominations will need to be returned **July 29.** If nominations are received, an election will be scheduled for August 2. If nominations are not received, the pastor may present a candidate.

What does the trustee-treasurer do?

He/She is responsible for keeping accurate and detailed accounts of receipts and disbursements for the parish. In general, this means being responsible for parish treasury activities including the care and custody of funds, assets, supervision of banking, credit, and insurance. This is done in partnership with parish staff and the Finance Council of the parish. He/She is an ex-officio member of the Finance Council.

Parish trustees are asked to:

- be registered in the parish
- be a practicing Catholic
- be at least 25 years of age
- make a two year commitment
- be willing to submit to a background check
- serve as ex-officio members of the pastoral council
- possess and/or acquire the same qualities as other pastoral council members
- receive appropriate training to the position
- participate fully in pastoral council activities including retreats and days of reflection
- embrace the same rights and responsibilities as other pastoral council members and work from the same sense of shared leadership and responsibility
- support and nurture the common vision developed by the pastoral council.
- participate fully and equally in decision making with other members of the pastoral council
- review and sign parish checks
- not serve as pastoral council officers, chairpersons of parish commissions, or coordinators of parish ministries.

Why do we have trustees?

Each parish in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee is an independent Religious Corporation established according to the Civil Statutes of the State of Wisconsin. The parish corporation is a civil body created solely for legal purposes. It has authority and competence only in those civil and secular matters for which it was created. Certain administrative matters dealt with by the Parish Corporation require that all five directors give their approval before the action is valid and legal. The members of each parish's board of directors are the archbishop, a vicar general of the archdiocese, the pastor, and two lay members of the parish referred to as "trustees."

This legal reality becomes part of parish life with and through the parish council. The trustees cannot adequately carry out their responsibilities in the legal and financial aspect of parish administration apart from the pastor and other members of the parish council.



DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

ARE WE JUDGMENTAL OR MERCIFUL?

Our lives are not to be filled with being judgmental but having mercy for others and showing them forgiveness. Easier said than done, right? Pope Francis said, "Who am I to judge." Jesus' words in the Gospel of John, "Let the one who is without sin cast the first stone." I have thought about these words relative to the parables in today's Gospel reading and I found the answer to be rather simple after a little reflection. What these words are meaning is to just allow God to act in His own time.

You see we learn from Jesus that God is aware that there are weeds growing within the wheat. God is content to let them grow together, only to be separated later, at harvest time. It is our task simply to produce for the harvest. It is not our role to uproot the weeds. Why, because it is not our role to be judgmental between the good and the bad. Our job is to watch them grow together, and in doing so with mercy and forgiveness. Well now how does this apply more to us? Read on.

In the Gospel, Jesus is really telling us that He knows the kingdom on earth was no paradise. Both good and evil existed together and not peacefully. So Jesus recommends how the wise farmer overcome the evil by the good. Refuse to yield to the rage of the weeds actually implied the hope for future repentance. The patient and forgiving will survive. A married person who chooses to reject rage in favor of forgiving their spouse has captured Jesus' liberating message. The person who demonstrates tolerance and compassion at work and in their personal life has uncovered Jesus' strategy for the kingdom. Parents who exercise long-suffering and patience with their families have grasped Jesus' understanding of freedom. All who prefer pardon to revenge, and understanding to retaliation, have accepted Jesus' manner of self-assertion.

To fully enter into the parables that Jesus gives we must be willing to spend time with the Gospel. Read it slowly. Understand what everything is telling us. For instance the weeds that are mentioned were really called darnel, a ryegrass that looks just like the wheat. The reason it was best to wait until harvest, was because the slaves in the Gospel wouldn't be able to judge the difference to burn it. In our lives we are not the ones who are also capable of judging another, only God is in that position. Actually let's face it, we really don't want that job. Just let "God be God." He'll take care of it all in His own time.

St. Francis De Sales says, "Hasty judgments are most displeasing to God, and men's judgments are hasty, because we are not judges one of another, and by judging we undertake our Lord's own office."
