

#### **ST. ANNE CORONAVIRUS UPDATE**

### Per the directives of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, the following precautions will be taken:

- Seating will be restricted to every other pew.
- Cleaning after Mass will continue.
- There will be an overflow area in the gathering once the church has reached 25% capacity. There will be chairs already set up. Feel free to move the chairs as needed to accommodate your family. These chairs will also be disinfected after each Mass.

#### **Offertory Procedures**

• For the offertory, we will not pass the baskets through the church, but rather place baskets in the sanctuary. You can leave your offering before or after Mass, or during the offertory time.

#### **Communion Procedures**

• Communion will ONLY be distributed by Fr. Bob. During the distribution of the Eucharist, Fr. Bob will come to each person as they are kneeling in the pew. Please do not leave the pews during Communion.

waukee, SJCA is outlining the best, most effective and reasonable methods for keeping our students and staff as safe as possible.



### **DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE**

#### **REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:**

#### THE BREAD OF LIFE

Jesus wanted to go off and be alone after John the Baptist's death. He was grieving. But the crowds interrupted Jesus' quiet time. Jesus wasn't annoyed though. The Gospel says, "He was moved with pity for them." The disciples were the ones that seemed to get upset with what was happening and they wanted the crowds to go away and buy their own dinners. I think this Gospel starts off with Jesus teaching us patience first of all. I'll bet the disciples were really getting nervous and upset with Jesus' decision to tell the crowds to stay and feed them. The disciples may have been losing their patience with Jesus. Just stop to think of all the people there and they have just enough food for them and He says, "feed them yourselves." Patience is a virtue that we always must work on to discover what Jesus is trying to teach us or else we miss it in life.

They are with Jesus and just did not initially look through their impatience with what Jesus can do. The disciples seemed to forget that they can always rely on Jesus to help them. He always taught them to pray first, but they let the lack of patience and trust in Jesus get in their way.

As with all of what Jesus' words and actions are, He is mentoring the disciples in what it really means to follow Him. In other words they shouldn't be sending the people away, but bringing them closer to them. They need to be with the people in order to see them, to understand them, to know their true needs, which are both spiritual and physical.

Jesus was moved with pity for the crowd, a dejected frustrated humanity that He loved. For Jesus, to be moved with pity means to heal, to be concerned means to provide food, to be filled means to fill others. He offers life to His people. For Jesus to live is to let live. I wonder how much the disciples learned that day.

Just like at Mass the priest takes the bread, and lifts up the host to heaven during the consecration, we to lift up our hearts to God offering up ourselves to Him each time we are at Mass. As we lift up our hearts we say the words, "My Lord and My God." The importance of the priest at Mass for us is simple. Without the priest we cannot receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, the Bread of Life.
