ST. ANNE CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Per the directives of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, the following precautions will be taken:

- Seating will be restricted to every other pew.
- Cleaning after Mass will continue.
- There will be an overflow area in the gathering once the church has reached 25% capacity. There will be chairs already set up. Feel free to move the chairs as needed to accommodate your family. These chairs will also be disinfected after each Mass.

Offertory Procedures

- For the offertory, we will not pass the baskets through the church, but rather place baskets in the sanctuary. You can leave your offering before or after Mass, or during the offertory time.

Communion Procedures

- Communion will ONLY be distributed by Fr. Bob. During the distribution of the Eucharist, Fr. Bob will come to each person as they are kneeling in the pew. Please do not leave the pews during Communion.

RCIA/ADULT CONFIRMATION CLASSES

The Catholic Church designed the RCIA process for everyone adult or child over seven years of age, who is: yearning for something more in their lives; interested in learning more about the Catholic Church; unbaptized and recognizing the need for spirituality in their lives; or baptized in the Catholic church or another Christian faith tradition but never received any formal religious training. This includes any Catholic adults who were never confirmed and would like to receive that sacrament. How long does it take? The Rite of Christian Initiation process ministers individually to those seeking membership. Some people need more time than others to prepare for a lifetime commitment. The sacraments of initiation are best celebrated with the entire faith community at the Easter vigil.

ST. JOSEPH CATHOLIC ACADEMY

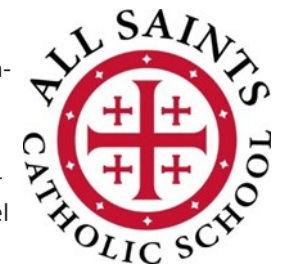

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

FAITH OUTSIDE THE BOAT?

During the storm on the sea, Peter steps outside of the boat to walk to Jesus. Peter was willing to walk to Jesus at first, but what happened? His faith wavered. Why? Peter didn't pay attention to the words he asked Jesus. "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." Peter asked Jesus to com-mand him. Jesus said, "come," a simple command. Peter's faith was weak, he didn't believe enough. Peter took his eyes off of Jesus. The stormy sea itself overpowered Peter's faith and trust in Jesus. His faith was not strong enough for him to stand on his own. His immediate cry for help was heard and he was saved. Peter then recognized that Jesus was truly the Son of God.

This Gospel can always give us comfort in our lives. We too end up stepping out of the boat many times and our faith wavers and we struggle with the turbulence of life. We all suffer with the many heart aches life brings, problems, pains, losses of loved ones, financial issues, loss of jobs, depression, anger, and the list goes on and on. This is the stormy sea of life all of us are in. Jesus says to all of us the same thing that He told Peter, "come." Then we have to keep our eyes directed on Jesus through the unrest of the sea of life. This Gospel is always a good reminder to us that we may always be reassured that the Lord is near us to hold our hand to keep us from drowning.

When we call, Jesus answers our call in our struggles. He is there for us, and we feel we prayed for His help, but sometimes we feel He didn't answer us. The reason is in this Gospel for us. Maybe we didn't trust enough in Jesus' help. Maybe we lacked faith during the time we were out of the boat just like Peter, too afraid of the turmoil we are in. Then we too took our eyes off of Jesus, just like Peter did and we start to drown in the sea of life's mayhem with lack of faith and trust.

When Peter became aware of the strength of the wind and water he flounders and he begins to sink. He calls out in distress, "Lord save me!" Jesus gives him His hand of strength. So even when our focus drifts and we become overwhelmed, we need not fear. The Lord is always ready to reach out a hand to stop us from sinking. We must place our trust in Jesus.

Saint Alphonsus Liguori says, "He who trusts in himself is lost. He who trusts in God can do all things."
