

ST. ANNE CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Per the directives of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, the following precautions will be taken:

- Seating will be restricted to every other pew.
- Cleaning after Mass will continue.
- There will be an overflow area in the gathering once the church has reached 25% capacity. There will be chairs already set up. Feel free to move the chairs as needed to accommodate your family. These chairs will also be disinfected after each Mass.

Offertory Procedures

• For the offertory, we will not pass the baskets through the church, but rather place baskets in the sanctuary. You can leave your offering before or after Mass, or during the offertory time.

Communion Procedures

• Communion will ONLY be distributed by Fr. Bob and Deacon Rich. During the distribution of the Eucharist, they will come to each person as they are kneeling in the pew. Please do not leave the pews during Communion.

*The dispensation from the Sunday Obligation to attend Mass has been extended to September 6.

RCIA/ADULT CONFIRMATION CLASSES

The Catholic Church designed the RCIA process for everyone adult or child over seven years of age, who is: yearning for something more in their lives; interested in learning more about the Catholic Church; unbaptized and recognizing the need for spirituality in their lives; or baptized in the Catholic church or another Christian faith tradition but never received any formal religious training. This includes any Catholic adults who were never confirmed and would like to receive that sacrament. How long does it take? The Rite of Christian Initiation process ministers individually to those seeking membership. Some people need more time than others to prepare for a lifetime commitment. The sacraments of initiation are best celebrated with the entire faith community at the Easter vigil.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Eucharistic Adoration is offered Wednesdays and Fridays from 7:30 am - 10:30 am. In an effort to ensure that there is always at least one person in church with Jesus, we ask that those attending Eucharistic Adoration that can commit to a full hour please sign up for a time slot on the sign-up sheet. The sign-up sheet can be found on our website under the "Eucharistic Adoration Sign-Up" button at the top of our website.

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The practice of Eucharistic Adoration is a centuries old ritual and falls within a broader category of devotions and rituals that are associated with the Sacrament of the Eucharist. In a particular way, Eucharistic Adoration is an extension of the worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that occurs in every Mass.

In a long-standing practice, a period of Eucharistic Adoration often ends with "benediction," the blessing of the faith with the Blessed Sacrament.

Several parishes throughout the United States have introduced the practice of perpetual Eucharistic Adoration, while other communities have the custom of shorter periods of Eucharistic Adoration. Care should always be taken that these periods of adoration respect the instructions outlined in Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass, the liturgical book that gives the instructions for the proper celebration of Eucharistic Adoration.

Although adoration of the Blessed Sacrament can never take the place of Eucharistic Communion, many Catholics find great comfort and consolation in their prayers before the Eucharist enshrined in the tabernacle or when it is exposed in the monstrance (both are equally valid, as the Christ is not more present in one than in the other). But when we consider our Eucharistic devotions, it is always important to remember the fundamental connection these acts of devotion have the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass and reception of Christ in Communion.

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

LEARNING FROM THE CANAANITE WOMAN

The Gospel reading can really teach us so much, especially about trust and confidence in God. Jesus always shows what happens when we have faith in Him. In today's Gospel, the Canaanite Woman displays a determined attitude, with her actions having persistence in her faith and trust in what Jesus can do for her. We can learn a lot by reflecting on her words and actions.

First, she is really a model for effective prayer. She comes to Jesus with faith and never questions whether Jesus is able to save her daughter from the demon or not. The Canaanite woman was confident that Jesus has the divine power necessary to release her little girl from demonic persecution. She simply trusts in Jesus as the Savior. Three times she calls Him "Lord."

Second, she is a model for perseverance, continuously asking Jesus for help. The Canaanite Woman kept persisting until she gained what she sought for her daughter. Just because Jesus initially ignored her or declined what she asked did not lessen her determination in pursuing His assistance.

Third, she is a model for humility. She did not take offense at the comparison between non-Jews and dogs. The reaction the woman gave was that there was no indication that her pride suffered in any way. The woman knew that Jesus could heal her daughter and she truly believed it. She didn't let anything waver her faith in Jesus even from the beginning with the direct no.

Persistence pays, even in prayer. Especially prayer. We have to remember that this woman risked social shame by approaching Jesus in public, being a Canaanite; a Gentile woman. She showed Jesus that she would not be silenced, and she therefore gained His attention and praise with her confident faith and trust. Her persistence was honored by the Lord. Jesus teaches that we need to pray and not to lose heart.

The woman is not put off by Jesus and neither are we when we follow the attitude of the Canaanite woman in today's Gospel reading. We must have effective prayer coming to Jesus with faith in our hearts. We don't stop, but are persistent in trusting that Jesus is listening to us and will not ignore us. And with prayer and perseverance, we remain humble realizing that we are to have faith and trust in Jesus, confident He knows what is always best for us. He will answer what is correct for us and those we love.

Repeat this prayer as often as you are reminded to do so and in preparation for the Sunday Liturgy. This is the Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."
