RCIA/ADULT CONFIRMATION CLASSES

The Catholic Church designed the RCIA process for everyone adult or child over seven years of age, who is: yearning for something more in their lives; interested in learning more about the Catholic Church; unbaptized and recognizing the need for spirituality in their lives; or baptized in the Catholic church or another Christian faith tradition but never received any formal religious training. This includes any Catholic adults who were never confirmed and would like to receive that sacrament. How long does it take? The Rite of Christian Initiation process ministers individually to those seeking membership. Some people need more time than others to prepare for a lifetime commitment. The sacraments of initiation are best celebrated with the entire faith community at the Easter vigil.

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

DO WE GRUMBLE AND MURMUR?

Today's parable in Jesus' Gospel is aimed at people who resemble murmurers. You know, any of us who grumble and murmur when we feel we've been mistreated, cheated, taken advantage of, forgotten, or are just plain jealous. I guess we all face that at one time or the other. Sometimes I think we can be better at grumbling or murmuring about something instead of seeing the generosity that is bestowed on others. The Gospel is also teaching us about how generous Jesus is. Really about how generous God is to all of us, but do we notice it? Many times we're worried about us and what we will get out of it all.

The parable is about coveting, about our frustration with the grace of God as it applies not us, but to others. We sometimes have a tendency to be resentful of what others receive from God. No, not if people we know have less than us, but if others seem to be exceeding us. Jealousy can kick in. We are often covetous and jealous when God's gifts of forgiveness and life's things are given to others in equal measure.

God's actions surpass our calculations and our human way of acting. He surprises us and sometimes it is uncomfortable. God is all giving and merciful, is the message in this parable. After all God has given us all the same gift to begin with, He gave us the gift of life. He gives us free will and graces, all we need to do are to pray and ask for them.

We always need to keep in mind that we are all equally beloved in the eyes of God. God will not prevent anyone from anything based on status, wealth, position, or years of service to Him on earth. In God's Kingdom each subject will receive the same, underserved, gift of eternal life. We cannot be envious because God is generous. The newly prepared disciple who makes a decision to follow Jesus today is just as important to the Lord as the disciple who has followed Him from childhood. There is a fullness and abundance in God's mercy and care that will provide what is enough, what is satisfying, for each. As children of the living God, we are to rejoice in his bounty, what is given both to us and to everyone.

None of us can ever predict the actions of God. That's what so great about God. He has a surprise for us around every corner. So whenever we may want to question God and ask why them Lord, think about the lines from our first reading today from Isaiah. "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts."
