

RCIA/ADULT CONFIRMATION CLASSES

The Catholic Church designed the RCIA process for everyone adult or child over seven years of age, who is: yearning for something more in their lives; interested in learning more about the Catholic Church; unbaptized and recognizing the need for spirituality in their lives; or baptized in the Catholic church or another Christian faith tradition but never received any formal religious training. This includes any Catholic adults who were never confirmed and would like to receive that sacrament. How long does it take? The Rite of Christian Initiation process ministers individually to those seeking membership. Some people need more time than others to prepare for a lifetime commitment. The sacraments of initiation are best celebrated with the entire faith community at the Easter vigil.

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

PEOPLE LIE, ACTIONS DON'T

How many times have we found it easier to tell someone what they wanted to hear with no intention of following through, rather than entering into a difficult conversation? We could think of tired parents who may tell their child, "I'll play with you later after dinner," only to have another excuse when that time comes. Or children who promise to clean their room, never intending to keep their word hoping their parents will forget. Some know how to flatter others and say just the right things, people pleasers. Those who say what you want to hear but have no intention of following through. Or, you have those who over promise and under deliver. In today's Gospel Jesus is challenging these behaviors and words. We have to keep in mind what Jesus said, "Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one." What Jesus says is so simple; we just need to follow the teacher.

Well there are times that we can talk a good game, but our actions mean something else. Here are some phrases that speak this: "Actions speak louder than words," "By their actions you shall know them," "I don't believe what you say. I believe what you do," and "people lie, actions don't." At one time or the other we may have heard one of these phrases. Jesus makes it very clear that our actions and words must match each other, and then we will be true believers by the fruits of our works. The message of this parable is simple; don't tell me what you are going to do, show me. God wants to see our faith in action.

Well then what is the secret to the spiritual life? The secret is simply to show up. You see God can't work on us if we are not there for Him. We have to pray, meditate, and ask God what He is wanting of us. Then we need to be quiet and listen. Then we need to get busy and show up. We need to change our selfishness into service. When we pray we must ask ourselves, "where did we see God today?" How then, will we live differently because of what God has revealed to us? This takes daily work, not just going to Mass for an hour on Sunday.

What will we end up doing for others through the course of the week when we leave Sunday Mass? It is not just our prayer time, but a time we tell Jesus that we are making some promises to live as He has taught us. At the end of Mass, after Fr. Bob gives his final blessing to all of us, I close with, "Go in peace, and glorify the Lord by your life." This means that we continue to worship Jesus by our actions during our week in the world, not by words, but by the choices we make with what we do in our deeds. St. Ignatius of Loyola said, "Love is shown more in deeds than in words."

Considering today's parable, which son are we more likely to be, (the one who commits but doesn't follow through, or the one who refuses but in the end complies)?
