

ALL SAINTS CATHOLIC SCHOOL



DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE ROSARY

We are currently in difficult times. There are so many people that are frightened. Today there is a warfare that is trying to dig deep into our hearts and our very souls. It is really a spiritual warfare. We need a strong weapon that we can use to combat the evil of our times. We have riots, killings, and the fear of the pandemic, looting, businesses closing, and hatred with developed anger that digs deep into our faith to try and destroy it. How do we combat this?

As Catholics we have been given the greatest arsenal to combat the evil we are facing today. We have the Mass, Adoration, and a sword that was made by God that can never be destroyed, the rosary. October is the Month of the Rosary. Sometimes we forget to say the rosary, but it's a prayer that has such great strength. In Fr. Donald Calloway's books, he always refers to the rosary as the sword of battle against the evil one. Yes, the rosary is a mighty sword, with the strongest prayers that are in it, the Hail Mary, the Our Father. We also have the Apostle's Creed and in between each decade we have the Fatima prayer given by the Blessed Lady, "Oh my Jesus forgive us our sins, and save us from the fires of hell and lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who are in most need of Thy mercy." At the end is the Hail Holy Queen.

The beautiful Hail Mary was forged together using the words of the Archangel Gabriel, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you," with the greeting of St. Elizabeth to Mary, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." The Our Father was taught to us by Jesus Himself. So when we pray the rosary we are using a sword against the evil of the world designed for us by Jesus Himself, the Archangel Gabriel, St. Elizabeth, and the Blessed Mother. No wonder this sword is so powerful to use against the evil one. It is a super spiritual blade of warfare for our times right now. It can't be destroyed. It was made just for us by God and the Blessed Mother wants us to use it with her. When we pray the rosary, Mary prays with us.

We have the disruption in our homes, the homeless, the hungry, the lost, and we have abortion, the loss of innocent lives, <u>lives that matter</u>. The rosary can be a powerful weapon said at home, anytime in church, especially at Adoration in front of Jesus Himself sitting on the altar, and the Blessed Lady praying with us to Jesus. He will help us in our desperation and with answers. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." We can't just say these words, but we must live the words that Jesus said. It is through the praying of the rosary we can follow Him, follow Him because He is the truth, and this is where we will start to find a new life in Him.

So let us use this month to pray the rosary daily and to develop it into a habit. We are in a battle in this world and we can focus our minds on the Mysteries of the Rosary. St. Anne has pamphlets, how to say the rosary. We can give them to you if you need one. St. Louis de Montfort says, "Our Lady blesses not only those who preach her rosary, but she highly rewards all those who get others to say it by their example." Be an example.
