DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

WE ARE DEPENDENT ON GOD!

This Sunday's readings all have a connecting theme. That theme is a total dependence on God. Isaiah talks about a time when the Lord will wipe away all of our tears, from every face and destroy death. St. Paul says, "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me." Then Jesus gives us the parable of the wedding feast.

Now this Gospel pulls the readings together. You see God invites all of us to the final feast. He gives us an invitation and He keeps inviting and never stops. He is always reminding us that we all have a place at His table. And it doesn't matter who we are or what we have done in life. Jesus loves all of us, and the invitation goes out to all of us, those who are the outcast and on the margins. Well stop to think about it, if God's wedding feast for His Son Jesus were only for the perfect, no one would be there. The table would be empty. This is true for getting into God's Kingdom.

But what do we need to do to help ourselves to be wearing the proper garment for Jesus? Get ourselves ready to be in the proper disposition to receive the Eucharist, the power of confession, or reconciliation. This way we can reexamine our lives and make sure that we show up ready. Because you see we are weak and the Eucharist is a powerful medicine that is the best nourishment for the weak. This banquet is open for everyone, even sinners like you and me. However sometimes our problem is we are too busy with other things in our life that takes priority over God, His Son, and the final banquet we are all called to. Right now what is pulling us away seems to be the corona virus. This is being the stumbling block for all of us. Now we all have been having different ways of living, job issues, all kind of problems, but most of all we are being pulled from God.

Right now more than ever prayer, reconciliation, the Eucharist, Adoration, the rosary, and the Mass are all so important to lean on for our strength to combat the virus. This is a time we need to recognize the value of our faith and our dependence on God and not a time to stay away from any of it. Perhaps Jesus is telling us that it is not enough to simply accept the invitation, but that we must go deeper than that. It is not enough to say we are Christian; we are called to live active lives of faith even through troubled times like these. So eventually it is up to us to accept the invitation to the feast. It is up to us to let Jesus know that, yes, we'll be there and we will make ourselves ready to enter the celebration with Him regardless of what obstacles try to prevent us from the Mass and the reception of His precious body in the Eucharist.

With October being the Month of the Rosary, may the rosary become a part of our daily prayer for the elections, end of abortion, increase faith during this pandemic, and for all to return to Sunday Mass.

St. Augustine says, "The angels surround and help the priest when he is celebrating Mass." How about including your guardian angel in on it?
