


CONFIRMATION RETREAT

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

"GIVE TO GOD WHAT BELONGS TO GOD"

Well first of all, Jesus' answer was practical and spiritual. Give what belongs to the emperor. The coins in their pocket, for instance, belong to the emperor, but once done give to God what is God's. Sounds simple, but what is God's? Everything! Yes, all we have, and all who we are, all we ever will be belongs to the Creator of all things.

Jesus' argument was so simple. The coin is Caesar's because it bears his image, then we who were made in God's image and likeness are His. Our whole life belongs to God and all we have in it.

Let's go back to the book of Genesis. Remember it says, "God created mankind in His image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them." So if we are to listen to the statement of Jesus, the directive to "give to God what is God's," we must give our all to God and act in His image. Let's face it, Jesus is sure a hard act to follow but that is what Jesus wants us to do.

So what are we talking about, we're talking about loyalty to the Creator who made us. We are made in His image and must repay God with our loyalty to Him by following His Son in our words, actions, and deeds. This way we repay to God what belongs to Him, our lives. We have to seek out our priorities. To do this, our hearts must be rooted in trust and gratitude for God. You see, our hearts are always seeking God, we just don't always realize it. St. Augustine says, "Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it finds its rest in thee."

God has His love within us to help us to make our decisions in life to come closer to Him. But God has given us a great gift, free will, the freedom to make a choice in life.

We can do this with our priorities, with how we act, and what is important to us. Jesus wants us to grow closer to His Father through Him.

In today's Gospel the Pharisees and the Herodians thought they would trick Jesus with their devious question, but Jesus, was teaching us that in the end God is what is always picked. Because it is through God, love grows within us. It is through this love growth that all of our true decisions are made. When God comes first then all of our decisions in life will come easier and made in the image of God who asks more of us. St. Augustine says, "Since love grows within you, so beauty grows. For love is the beauty of the soul."

An article from the National Catholic Register talked about how our earthly obligations often are defined by various political rules, and that we may meet them. However it said though, that the demands of politics must always come after our foundational relationship with the Lord. We never want to muddy our relationship with God. It says this was the case with the Pharisees. Definitely a Gospel for our time.

So regardless of our choices in life Jesus is saying, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and To God what belongs to God." Remember the beauty of our very soul depends on it.
