DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

ROADMAP TO SAINTHOOD

Would we like to be a saint? Well of course we would, but we don't think we are worthy to be like the saints we read about. St. Francis of Assisi, St. Augustine, St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis de Sales, St. Teresa of Calcutta, St. Pope John Paul II, and the list goes on beginning with the Apostles. There are so many, and some we don't even know. How does this happen? It's not just for priests and religious.

Actually we have to remember that some of the biggest sinners became saints. The words in the Gospel today remind us of what holiness looks like. It shows us the roadmap that the saints used to get to heaven. Yes, the Beatitudes were the roadmap used by the saints. They practiced the attributes of "poor in spirit," "meek," and "merciful." This brought them a sanctity that they now enjoy in heaven with the Lord.

But what can we do? We can use the Beatitudes as our own personal roadmap to Sainthood. To be "meek" is to be humble. We have to have strength and courage, a full dependence on God. Always a full trust in God in all we do. All decisions we make.

Being humble is not just being quiet and saying anything. It is letting others know where we stand in our faith, in the truth of what the Church teaches.

"The poor in spirit," having a spiritual condition of poverty in us. This means really recognizing our need for God in our lives. We strive to develop our prayer life to get closer to God, and have a hunger for Him. Attend Mass frequently, Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Adoration with praying the rosary daily. Many of the saints did daily Adoration to the Blessed Sacrament expressing "poor in spirit."

Blessed are they who "mourn," expressing deep sorrow over our sins. The sorrow is to the point that we are repentant of our sins. Reconciliation is frequented to help enhance the graces we keep receiving with Jesus' love and forgiveness. The best way to reduce and then eliminate sinful habits is through Reconciliation. It means that we are gentle and humble and self-less.

Blessed are the "merciful," showing mercy to others. This is because we will understand mercy due to our own dependence and weaknesses. We will receive gracious and merciful gifts from God with the love we show to others.

Blessed are the "clean of heart," by making the right choices with our free will.

This will create in us an inner purity, enabling us to go to heaven and to see God.

To "hunger and thirst for righteousness," by living a life of doing good. We put our lives in the hand of God and do His will alone. He will grant us the help that we will need by our lived trust in Him.

Blessed the "peacemakers," by always reconciling with God and others we start to help God spread that peace and unity around the entire world. It grows from us to others through families, the neighbors, at work, at school, and then to cities and states.

When we are "persecuted for the sake of righteousness," by giving up things we love, when we know they are not good. Not thirsting for power or for wealth, not hungering for this will help us go to heaven.

So the bottom line is the Beatitudes lead us to doing God's will. Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen says, "To do God's Will until death, that is the inner heart of all holiness." Our Roadmap to Sainthood.
