

This KCSA taskforce, representing Kenosha clergy, school board members, administrators, faculty, parents, parish representatives, and key Catholic community leaders, will be uncovering opportunities to further the excellence of a city-wide Catholic school network in Kenosha.

Independence of our Kenosha Catholic Schools. All Saints Catholic School and St Joseph Catholic Academy each remain separate schools within the new Kenosha Catholic Schools Alliance. KCSA simply seeks to formalize the cooperation the two schools have always informally maintained and provides new opportunities to build on the schools' Catholic mission and to better serve the Catholic community in Kenosha.

ESTATE PLANNING & ASSET PROTECTION



RCIA/ADULT CONFIRMATION CLASSES

The Catholic Church designed the RCIA process for everyone adult or child over seven years of age, who is: yearning for something more in their lives; interested in learning more about the Catholic Church; unbaptized and recognizing the need for spirituality in their lives; or baptized in the Catholic church or another Christian faith tradition but never received any formal religious training. This includes any Catholic adults who were never confirmed and would like to receive that sacrament. How long does it take? The Rite of Christian Initiation process ministers individually to those seeking membership. Some people need more time than others to prepare for a lifetime commitment. The sacraments of initiation are best celebrated with the entire faith community at the Easter vigil.

DEVOTIONAL & PRAYER LIFE

REFLECTION FROM DEACON RICH:

WELL DONE, MY GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT

How are we doing? What do you think? Is Jesus satisfied with us? When our end approaches will we hear Jesus say, "Well done, my good and faithful servant." I suppose we all pray and are hoping so. But just to pray and hope it will happen is just not enough. Jesus wants to see us in action.

In the first reading we get a real good example of a woman who has loving hands. It tells of all that she does for others. How do we work with our hands to serve others? How do we help those people that we know, and even more so those who we don't know? By doing so the reading says there will be a reward for us.

The second reading is saying our end comes to us like a thief in the night. We will never know when the Lord will come. We can't fall asleep, but we must stay awake and not be taken by surprise when the day of the Lord comes. St. Paul writes to the Thessalonians, "You are children of the light." So let's think about this for a minute and ask ourselves how do we strive to be a light in places or times of darkness in our lives?

In our world today it is obvious that we have been given much and we really can see very easily those who have little. Now I'm not talking about money and prestige. I'm talking about God's gifts to us and what are God's expectations of us in our lives. You see Jesus came into this world to teach God's people and to prepare them to carry on His work in this world. In other words we then are responsible for proclaiming the Gospel, teaching others how to live as God's people, help the poor, reaching out to others as our brothers and sisters, the homeless, the sick, and the lonely. Helping at St. Anne's ministries, there are so many to choose from.

Now where do we start? First of all the ones we need to learn from are the servants in the Gospel who doubled what they had been given. The servant who buried his talent was the wrong one to follow. He pretends to be on good terms with his owner but does not do his duty. He's kind of like the person today who believes that the life of faith has nothing to do with anyone else but only with God. Faith is private. But is it? Faith is to be lived and seen. We start with going to confession, or reconciliation. We get our hearts and souls into the proper disposition with God. Once we have freed ourselves of our sin, of all our guilt, we can then have a more loving open mind to start to do all the above mentioned. Yes, confession is the key to start it. It's where we meet Jesus in the confessional and all is forgiven. We now can pursue everything so much easier with joy and contentment.

Faith is life, which is expressed in love. Being afraid is equivalent to having no faith. And so now to keep our faith strong, daily prayer from our heart is important, because we have now cleansed it with confession. We pray the rosary daily and do an examination of our conscience every evening. All of this brings about a true joy in our lives. We have then prepared ourselves for whenever the time may come. Padre Pio says, "Joy, with peace, is the sister of charity. Serve the Lord with laughter." Then when we do face the Lord we may hope to hear Him say, "Well done, my good and faithful servant." Wouldn't that be great?
